- Continuation of the Sexual Assault Prevention programming for more than 1,600 undergraduate members. It will educate our Brothers how to be advocates on our campuses to prevent sexual violence.
- First of its kind New Member Education program, The Legion, for more than 500 new members. The Legion is a self-directed and blended learning initiative that will prepare our new members for membership into our Brotherhood and prepare them to be leaders on campus and in society.

The Kappa Delta Rho Foundation provides a vital support function in the growth and success of Kappa Delta Rho by providing financial resources to keep our fraternity strong and growing.

With the support of our alumni and friends, more than \$266,984 has been granted to the Fraternity for educational and leadership programming since 2013. In addition, \$529,400 in chapter-specific or field-of-study-specific scholarships has been awarded to Kappa Delta Rho undergraduates and alumni during this time.

The Foundation's asset allocation places priority on preserving endowment corpus by conservatively investing in a mix of equity and debt index funds



to produce investment returns at a rate exceeding inflation. The Investment Committee of the Foundation is responsible for the management of all endowed funds of the Kappa Delta Rho Foundation. These funds include the general endowment, which supports the educational programming of the Fraternity, as well as the numerous scholarships designated to support the ongoing education of our active members and alumni pursuing undergraduate and graduate degrees.

SCHOLARSHIPS 2017

The Foundation fully supports the creation and endowment of new scholarships and has established policies governing restricted purpose and endowment funds consistent with applicable law. We account for these assets in separate funds based on fund purpose and donor-imposed restrictions. The Foundation seeks to preserve the corpus and utilize only earnings for all endowment funds with a current maximum payout rate of 5% (as defined in its Investment Policy Statement – revised 2011).

An endowment fund is formed only upon the creation and acceptance by the Foundation of an Endowment Fund Agreement that conforms to relevant policy. In recent years, several scholarships have become fully endowed including the Richard J. Petronis Zeta Beta Scholarship Fund, the Paul Downes Iota Beta Scholarship Fund and the Robert D. Lynd Scholarship Fund.

An additional avenue of service provided by the Foundation is offering short-term loans to chapters in need through the Chapter Loan Fund. The Fund was established by the Trustees to make loans as an aid to chapters or alumni corporations of the fraternity in building, remodeling, purchasing, financing

or refinancing chapter houses or for acquiring equipment, furnishings, or fixtures for the chapter. The Fund acts as a revolving fund and all loan payments, including interest are retained within the Fund and recycled for future chapter loans.







WHY DOES THIS MATTER?

These alumni have made a firm commitment to provide a legacy that fosters and perpetuates the values of our Founding Fathers. Furthermore, this legacy provides an environment for undergraduate KDRs that promotes and nurtures honor, integrity, and excellence in education and leadership.

"MY ESTATE ISN'T LARGE. CAN I REALLY MAKE A DIFFERENCE?"

is a comment I hear frequently. To me, the size of an alumnus' planned gift isn't the most important consideration. The significance lies in an individual Brother's decision to put his money to work productively for the benefit of future generations. Whether your planned gift is \$1,000, \$10,000, \$100,000, or even \$1 million, every dollar has the potential to change the lives of undergraduate KDRs.

In addition, an alumnus' planned gift fulfills one of the main missions of the Foundation. It "collaborates with, and financially supports the educational, leadership, and character development programs undertaken by The National Fraternity of Kappa Delta Rho." Your active partnership in our mission to educate outstanding leaders is vital. Today, consider adding your name to the list of **Heritage Society** members.



IN MY CASE, Kappa Delta Rho has been a significant part of my life experience. I have the good fortune to know many Brothers from different chapters and different eras. Their experiences in KDR vary, but the friendship, brotherhood, and leadership experiences have impacted their lives. Charity starts at home with kids, grandkids, and other family commitments. However, I can't ask you to support the Heritage Society unless I'm willing to make that kind of commitment too. We all have different resources and responsibilities, but it's important to realize that many of us can have a lasting impact that will affect countless young men who follow us by making a commitment to the KDR Foundation. Consequently, my estate plan calls for a seven-figure planned gift to the Foundation when I pass into Chapter Eternal. That's my investment in the future, but above all, it's my personal commitment to a set of core Fraternal values and ideals that are more important today than ever before.

Is your estate plan complete?

- ✓ Do you have a current will?
- Have you executed a durable power of attorney to provide for the management of your affairs if you become incapacitated?
- Have you executed a living will, setting forth your wishes about medical treatment?
- Have you reviewed beneficiary designations of your life insurance policies and retirement accounts to make sure they reflect your current wishes?
- ✓ Have your included in your estate plan a legacy gift for the Kappa Delta Rho Foundation or other charitable organizations that have been important in your life?

WHAT'S YOUR NEXT STEP?

When you have made the important decision to create a will or trust or revise an existing one, or to designate the Foundation as beneficiary of a life insurance policy, I recommend you work with your attorney or financial advisor. There are several options to consider. For example, you may restrict your planned gift to a specific program endowment or you may want to set up an endowed scholarship fund for your chapter, or you can stipulate a particular area of academic study.
