THERE ARE MANY DIFFERENT DEFINITIONS OF RESILIENT. The one that I feel fits Kappa Delta Rho the best is "tending to recover from or adjust easily to misfortune or change". Now, I do not believe that KDR has had any misfortune lately as a National Fraternity, but some local chapters have. I believe that we all have adjusted to and will continue to work through change.

Kappa Delta Rho has been resilient since 1905. It has survived two world wars, many other crises, and a great depression. Now we are building as we come out of the most recent epic pandemic. Through this pandemic we have had a few chapters close, some for lack of drive, some for mistakes made by undergraduates, but the National Fraternity is expanding and growing stronger. We have chapters opening at the University of St. Francis in Joliet, IL, and are expanding back to Virginia Tech and the University of Charleston in West Virginia. Through change this Fraternity is stronger.

Over the past year our Fraternity has utilized its resources, and assistance from alumni, to continue its mission of helping our undergraduate Brothers succeed. We have used Zoom meetings and given the Chapters access, so they can operate smoothly when they could not meet in person. Many Chapters were able to recruit and grow during this time. Our online, nationwide, New Member education program that was developed over the past few years paid off handsomely. New Brothers were able to learn about and be initiated into our brotherhood; a feat that many other national fraternities were not able to accomplish.

I believe that we all have adjusted to and will continue to work through change.

We held our 2020 National Convention, 2021 Elmon M. Leadership Academy and 2021 Consuls Academy virtually to continue and show the undergraduates that their success was paramount to KDRs' success. The National Staff held weekly meetings with the Chapters and had open Zoom Office Hours like many of the college professors at our host institutions. This gave the undergraduates the knowledge that even though some things were different, we were still here to help them grow.

Our focus moving into the new academic year is our collaboration with the KDR Foundation and supporting the Brothers' Keeper Capital Campaign. The purpose of this collaboration is to build an endowment to strengthen the Health & Wellness programming of KDR. The Brothers' Keeper Capital Campaign will have benefits for the undergraduates and alumni as well. Many of us have had challenges, or know Brothers that have had struggles, that they just need someone to reach out to. As our Brothers' Keeper we should do all we can to assist in these situations. One aspect of this campaign is the establishment of KDR Lifelines. This website provides pertinent information on Mental Health for our Brothers and appropriate links to access help immediately if needed. RECRUITMENT RESILIENCY:

Lessons Learned Through Recruitment During a Pandemic

THIS PAST YEAR, Chapters were impacted by new challenges the pandemic created for their college experience. Some Chapters were able to have classes in-person while others took their classes online or a version of both. No matter how Brothers continued their studies, they all had to adapt to different recruitment styles and tactics to continue the KDR legacy on their campus.

Anticipating the upcoming challenges, Brothers of the Pi Alpha new member recruitment team at the University of Toledo focused on preparing over the summer for a semester of uncertainty. Consul Remi Sanchez and New Member Recruitment Chair Nick Lombardo worked to reallocate their recruitment budget to use money they would have used for advertisements and flyers to spend on individual interactions. Creative thinking focused their chapter recruitment on intentional, one-on-one meals and outdoor activities that prioritized connection and safety above everything else. By utilizing the summer to consider alternatives beyond normal operations, Brothers Lombardo and Sanchez focused their recruitment on making things personal and ultimately, their fall recruitment season was a success.

While planning was a key factor in some Chapter's success, other Chapters capitalized on the effects of the pandemic. "How we got so many guys was we got [the potential new members] to recruit for us," said Brother Benjamin Molen from the Zeta Beta Chapter at Tarleton State University. "They got their friends to kind of come out around us and it kept spiraling like that. Especially with everyone being cooped up since March. Everyone's itching to just do something." As daily life around the world was interrupted, each chapter faced different levels of restrictions based on their state and local guidelines. Zeta Beta recruitment events mostly occurred outside as that was deemed the safest. As to the whole experience, Brother Molen shared that the biggest lesson he learned was to "expect the unexpected because I came into this semester with low hopes on recruitment just because of the all the restrictions and all that and we just kind of managed to somehow turn it around."

At The Ohio State University, Provisional Kappa Chapter focused not only on adapting to the circumstances and thinking outside the recruitment box, but putting genuine connections above any type of sales pitch. "I think that stuck out to a lot of [Potential New Members] as 'hey these guys are real and they're not just trying to get another number and another name on their roster.' And that wound up ultimately being successful," said Senior Tribune Brother Carson Albright. "And it made all of recruitment easier because we didn't have to put on some sort of face or some sort of act. It was just us being who we were and we attracted the people that were going to fit in best."

While the pandemic may have forced everyone to change recruitment strategies, there are some larger lessons that will continue to be applied for years to come. "The big takeaway was authenticity wins," said Brother Albright. "It spoke volumes that we were able to attract the right guys for us and they were in the right place for them because we were ourselves. [...] It was huge that we were authentic and it paid off for us on so many different levels, and it's definitely something were going to apply forever."

The resiliency of Kappa Delta Rho is demonstrated in every way Chapters adapted during uncertain times. As the Credo states "...My name is FRATERNITY. And because I have given Man that which he craves, I shall endure..." Whether it was planning ahead, capitalizing on an opportunity, leaning into authenticity, or a combination of multiple strategies, Chapters rose to the challenge to continue moving the KDR mission forward, to add new lustre to it's name.









ON JANUARY 21, 2020 the first case of 2019 novel coronavirus was confirmed in the United States.⁺ In the months that followed, campuses closed, events were cancelled, jobs were lost, and life changed in innumerable ways for all of us. Then on December 11, 2020 the first Covid-19 vaccine was approved.⁺ As vaccines have been increasingly available, new Covid-19 infection rates have steadily declined.^{*} The first promise of a return to some level of normalcy is on the horizon. With that comes a slow return to campuses, offices, events, and social interactions. For many this return to normal brings with it mixed emotions.

As COVID-19 restrictions have been in for over a year, we have adjusted to our present day normal. We have routines in place. Daily life has become predictable. Our brains like the predictable; it brings a sense of calm when everything feels out of control. A return to pre-covid normal brings change. It continues our uncertainty. In a pandemic, it is difficult to predict the next phase as concerns about variants continue even with vaccination rates going up. Considering a return to normal is causing anxiety for a lot of people.

While many of the situations with Covid-19 are not in your control, there is a lot you can do to decrease your anxiety. *First, remember that what you are feeling is normal and expected.* Anxiety is frequently triggered by change and not knowing what to expect. We don't know what to expect as society starts to slowly get back to normal. Our brains like routines. We do better in routines because we know what to expect and don't have to spend extra mental energy thinking about what to do next. When things started to shut down in early 2020, that was a change in routine, and we were anxious and frustrated. The same will happen as things open back up.

Second, go slow. If you spent the bulk of your time in quarantine alone, it's going to take a bit of time to adjust

to spending time in groups again. Start with a friend or two. Go to the grocery store more often. Work your way up to a small gathering of friends while following CDC guidelines. The more that you spend time with others, the easier it will become. Remember that doing things that make you anxious will temporarily increase your anxiety in the short term, but decrease your anxiety in the long term. Stick with it and you will get better at dealing with the anxiety. If you find that your anxiety remains at levels high enough to impair your ability to get done what you want and need to do, then it's time to seek professional help.

Third, accept that things will not be exactly the same.

Some regulations will likely remain in place, and you may find that some aspects of quarantine life work better for you. Don't push yourself to return to life exactly as things were before. Try not to compare yourself to others. Move at your own speed. Any forward motion is positive.

Finally, let go. Covid rage is a very real thing. But you cannot control the actions of others. Allowing their actions to drive you into resentment and anger only hurts yourself. Some people will return to normal faster than you may be comfortable with. You can't control that, but you can control your reaction to their behavior.

As we all consider the possibility of life after Covid-19, we have an opportunity to reflect on what we want to take away from our experience. Think about the positives and negatives. You might not be able to think of any positives and that's ok. The point is to reflect about your experience and decide how you want to move forward. Change is inevitable but you can be in control of how you respond.

Brother Selected as Fulbright Scholar to Research Reverse Auctions on Blockchain Networks

FOR MOST STUDENTS, the study abroad experience consists of laid-back elective classes in popular locations such as Italy, Spain, or the United Kingdom. For others, like Brother Zane Billy (Omega '22), the study abroad experience looks a little different. Brother Billy, a recently selected Fulbright Scholar through the Canada Mitacs Globalink Program, will spend his summer as a remote research



student at Lakehead University in Thunder Bay.

Ontatrio. The Canada Mitacs Globalink Fulbright Program is considered a co-op with research organization Mitacs for international educational exchange between the United States and Canada; selection for the program is an honor.

Zane is actively involved on campus as the Vice President of the American Philanthropic Organization and as a student Portfolio Manager for Student Managed Investment Portfolio (SMIP), a University program which allows students to manage investment funds that help to financially support the school's educational initiatives. His interest in the digital economy, though, can be attributed to his time working for a local bank paired with his interest in information systems. It was there that he developed an interest in "FinTech" and blockchain which ultimately inspired his Fulbright research.



While conducting his research, Zane will work with blockchain and smart contracting technology, which has emerged as a useful tool that helps power the mechanisms behind cryptocurrencies such as Bitcoin and Ethereum. He will spend the majority of his time researching existing auction designs in order to migrate a reverse auction server into blockchain smart contracts using the Ethereum cryptocurrency environment as a foundation.

Selection as a Fulbright Scholar is an admirable accomplishment. Zane states that he could not have achieved this feat alone. Spurred on by his roommates, all four of whom are Kappa Delta Rho Brothers, he had the encouragement and support needed to pursue his passion.

Philanthropy Efforts Essential During Pandemic

OUR PRECEPTS PRECISELY STATE: "...engage in the service of mankind, not for the praise or recognition that such service may bring, but because it is the right thing to do." During a global pandemic the easy route was to give up and put our normal routine on the back burner, but this would not be the right thing.

For the 2020-2021 academic year our Brothers raised \$22,657 to raise awareness and support the fight against childhood cancer. Through a partnership with UDance, a student lead organization at the University of Delaware, our Alpha Beta Brothers were able to exceed their fundraising goal for the year. A total of \$1,560,035 was raised for the B+ foundation through UDance.

Philanthropy is not easy, but is essential for the service of mankind, so I reached out and interviewed Brother Scott Benosky, Alpha Beta '22, to understand more about the challenges of humanitarianism of this scale. While service is difficult in any circumstance, ingenuity and creativity are essential for success. "We couldn't

really have any events that weren't online, so we had to improvise," Benosky said, "Something we did to get the Brothers excited was to make it more of a competition instead of just another hassle for them to deal with." Efforts like these push KDR to be more than another fraternity, it shows we strive for excellence and a Brotherhood seeking to do better.

In overcoming adversity, there are so many factors which may stagger your success, but something that Benosky suggests Chapters should consider is to, "use the interests of your chapter to your advantage and find what makes them tick." So often we can ignore the obvious, but sometimes the right thing to do is work smarter, not harder. Scott saw what drove so many Chapters of our excellent Fraternity and found new ways to overcome the adversities of not only an incredible philanthropy effort, but also a pandemic.

I AM DEEPLY HONORED AND HUMBLED to be writing my first Quill and Scroll article as President of the Kappa Delta Rho Foundation. It has been a busy year getting my arms around a different role with different obligations. There have been plenty of "learning moments" as responsibilities get transitioned, but as we continue to move forward, every bump in the road gets smoothed out. We stand up to meet and overcome every challenge. This has been a time for our Fraternity to show its resilience and position itself to be stronger in the years ahead. That is exactly what we are doing. We have a very dedicated and supportive group of volunteers and donors who believe in the value of our Fraternity and have great ideas as to how we can grow. Nearly 800 Brothers completed the Donor and Alumni Perception Study conducted by Cygnus Applied Research during the fall. The Foundation Board is taking those insights and turning them into action items to enhance our outreach to alumni. Alumni want to know that their support is positively impacting our undergraduate Brothers and Chapters. For certain Brothers that feel called to lead the way, the Foundation works hand-in-hand with them to leave a lasting legacy of philanthropy. To that end, the Foundation approved two new funds this year that will support improved housing for our Chapter at the University of Illinois and provide additional scholarships to our undergraduates at Indiana University.

There is much more that we can do together to improve and enhance the fraternity experience for our Brother-

hood. One of the most important challenges that our Brotherhood currently faces is helping our undergraduate Brothers deal with the emotional and mental stresses that encompass their daily lives. KDR is developing new, cutting edge programming to enhance the health and wellness of our undergraduate Brothers; Brothers' Keeper. This strategic plan, consisting of multiple phases, will provide mental health awareness and support while promoting and strengthening responsible personal behavior. Providing the programming is in line with our Precepts where we promise to "engage in the service of mankind, not for the praise or recognition that such service may bring, but because it is the right thing to do". Executing a capital campaign to fund the Brothers' Keeper initiative



is the "right thing to do", we are making it a reality. *Thus far, over \$1.2M in commitments have been received from supportive undergraduates, alumni and parents*. We still have a long way to go to achieve or exceed our \$2.5M goal, but we have good momentum.

The Foundation approved two new funds this year that will support improved housing for our Chapter at the University of Illinois and provide additional scholarships to our undergraduates at Indiana University.

The Kappa Delta Rho Foundation, through educational grants and more than \$100,000 in scholarships, provides our Brotherhood a portion of the resources necessary to successfully navigate the college experience. None of this would be possible without the Brothers, friends of KDR, and parents of our undergraduates who financially support the Fraternity's efforts. We are truly grateful for their support and will work diligently to be worthy of the faith they have placed in us. We are laying the foundation (pun intended) of a more successful future for Kappa Delta Rho.

Thank you for your confidence in me and for providing me the opportunity to serve.

- Mental Health First Aid (https://www.mentalhealthfirstaid.com/): Mental Health First Aid teaches you how to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illness and substance use disorders in your community.
